





Jet Boating





Fishing

The Peace Country is a haven for anglers year-round. From ice fishing in winter to summer expeditions at Figure 8 Lake and Notikewin Provincial Park, discover abundant fishing spots that promise relaxation and excitement amidst scenic landscapes.

Best spots according to the locals:

- Figure 8 Lake offers Great Rainbow trout fishing from the dock or by boat.
- Notikewin Provincial Park Home to plenty of freshwater fish species, including Walleye, Perch, and Northern Pike.
- Running Lake Be on the lookout for Rainbow and Brook Trout.
- <u>Cummings Lake</u> catch and release fishing in the summer and in the fall, plenty of Rainbow Trout to grill up.
- Stoney Lake Expect to catch Yellow Perch, Rainbow Trout, or Brook Trout.
- <u>Haig Lake</u> Known for Pickerel, Whitefish, and Jackfish commonly caught in this lake.
- Murphy's Flats If you're trying to catch some Mountain Whitefish, this is your spot.

3 Amazing Vistas

Tour local lookouts for stunning views of the Peace River Valley and immerse yourself in early regional history. From Twelve Foot Davis Gravesite to Kauffman Hill Drive, these sites offer picturesque perspectives and opportunities for short hikes.

A Local Tip: While the valley is beautiful at any time of day, morning or afternoon are optimal times for seeing the valley defined and highlighted by the angle of the sun (as opposed to the noon hour).

Twelve Foot Davis Gravesite

Henry Fuller Davis, known as Twelve Foot Davis, was a pioneering figure who made his fortune in gold and established a successful trading business along the Peace River. His gravesite overlooks the Peace River Valley, offering stunning views. Amenities include picnic tables, benches, and interpretive plaques.

Don't forget your camera for breathtaking valley and Peace River photos!

5 Kauffman Hill Drive

Named after an American homesteader, Kauffman Hill Drive provides a scenic route with views of historic cabins, lush farmland, and the Peace River Valley.

Descend through the densely-treed Pat's Creek gorge with vistas of the merging rivers to the south.

12 Foot Davis Events Park

Located near the Heart River, this park features a natural amphitheater and a picturesque footbridge. It's a great spot for events and photography, offering views of the river valley and an impressive trestle bridge.

Directions to 12 Foot Davis Events Park:

From downtown Peace River:

- Head south on Peace River Main Street (100 Street).
- Turn left onto 102 Avenue, then south on 101 Street.
- Turn left onto 103 Avenue just after the Heart River Bridge.
- Drive to the end of the road and park near Heritage Towers.
- Cross the footbridge to reach the park.

Sagitawa Lookout/ Greene Valley Provincial Park

Sagitawa Lookout, named for its Cree origin meaning "where the rivers meet," provides picnic tables and a barbecue area with views of the Peace, Smokey, and Heart Rivers.

Enjoy a peaceful day-use area and stunning vistas of the Town of Peace River and surrounding waterways.

Directions to Sagitawa Lookout/Greene Valley Provincial Park: Driving (5 minutes):

- From 12 Foot Davis Events Park, return to 101 Street (Highway 744).
- Follow signs for Highway 744/Judah Hill.
- The lookout is located at the top of the valley on the right.

Local Tip: After enjoying the view from Sagitawa Lookout, carefully cross the road to explore Greene Valley Provincial Park's wildlife preserve. Your best bet is to ask a local about the accessible areas because Google Maps isn't 100% reliable out here!








Ever Dreamed of Growing Your Own Garden?

Spring Planting Strategy

Whether you have a small plot or acres to cultivate, gardening in the Peace Country offers a rewarding experience of growing your own food. Knowing where your food comes from adds a special connection to your meals.

The region's fertile lands and distinct growing season make it ideal for both beginners and seasoned gardeners.



Spring Planting Strategy

The frost-free growing season typically spans from May 25 to September 4, totaling about 102 days.

Here's a guide to maximize your spring planting:

Early Spring (March-April): Start indoors: Broccoli, cauliflower, cabbage, lettuce, spinach (around March 16).

Direct sow: Peas (sugar snap, English), onions, potatoes (around March 26).

Late Spring (May): Transplant seedlings: Tomatoes, peppers, eggplants (around May 21).

Direct sow: Beans, corn, squashes, cucumbers, watermelons, pumpkins (around May 25).

Ensure to adjust planting times based on local weather conditions.

Fall Planting Strategy

Fall planting in the Peace Country requires careful timing to harvest before winter frosts begin around September 4:

Here's a guide to maximize your fall planting:

Early Fall (July-August): Transplant seedlings: Broccoli, cauliflower, cabbage, lettuce, spinach (around June 16).

Direct sow: Beans, beets, carrots, radishes (varied dates).

Late Fall (August): Direct sow - Garlic (around July 21).

Extend your growing season by starting warm-weather crops indoors and transplanting them outdoors after the last frost.

Local Gardening Tips:

- Monitor soil temperature for optimal planting times.
- Use the local climate to your advantage by selecting cold-hardy varieties.
- Consider using season extenders like row covers or cold frames to protect plants from early and late frosts.

By planning your garden around the Peace Country's unique growing conditions, you'll enjoy fresh, homegrown produce from spring through fall.


Winter Adventures in the Peace Country




