Overview: PREDA's Executive Director has compiled an overview report which is complemented with baseline statistics and trend reports. Input from our municipal members was compiled through a combination of e-surveys, sharing internal housing related documents, by-law reviews, and one-on-one conversations with Councillors, CAO's and EDO's. External stakeholders representing builders and housing foundations also contributed to the collation of the information presented.

Open-floor: Moderator Ken Hildebrand – PREDA Vice Chair

Development Costs: From land-purchase to keys for a home – what is your municipal check-list? Are there external development costs out of municipal control?

Net Zero: Changes in building codes to meet net zero targets can create significant extra costs.

Home Insurance: Contingent upon forced upgrades is emerging (e.g. windows, roofs, furnaces) which places significant costs on the homeowner and can jeopardize mortgage renewal.

Newcomers: Most PREDA municipalities have created specific recruitment committees targeted for doctors and other high-level professionals. Outside of this scope there are numerous newcomer families with various levels of skills immigrating to the PREDA region. **Donat Mpunga**, Director of Programs for the [Center for Newcomers](#) highlights that access to affordable housing is crucial to integration.
